


The proceeds from this outing will help fund local college students who are pursuing a degree in safety. Your participation and support play a crucial role in fostering the next generation of safety leaders.

Behind-the-Scenes at Purdue University: Exploring Campus Safety

On July 12, our chapter had the incredible opportunity to visit the Purdue University campus for a behind-the-scenes look at safety on a college campus. One of the highlights of our visit was touring their on-site nuclear reactor, which is used for educational purposes. We gained valuable insights into the testing and uses of the reactor, enhancing our understanding of campus safety measures and protocols.

It was a fascinating experience that showcased the commitment to safety and innovation at Purdue University. We extend our gratitude to the university for hosting us and providing such an informative tour.







Here is a little bit about the reactor from Purdue's Website:

PUR-1, Purdue's Nuclear Reactor

The Purdue University Reactor Number One (PUR-1) is the first and only nuclear reactor operating in Indiana. It is the first and only US NRC facility to be licensed for a fully digital safety and control system. As part of a fleet of 25 University reactors across the US, it has been designated as part of the critical infrastructure for the country. The primary mission of the facility is to teach and train the next generation of Nuclear Engineers. In addition to its educational uses, the reactor acts as a neutron source for activation analysis to support other departments including engineering, health science, chemistry, pharmacy, agriculture, biology, and nanotechnology.

Licensed to a thermal power level of 12 kW, the reactor has an average thermal flux of 2.1x10¹¹ nv. At this level, the facility features maximum flexibility for a broad spectrum of experiments with an industry leading safety envelope. Three full time employees perform day-to-day operations including maintenance, experiment support, and customer development.


