





The Chapter hosts the WISE (Women in Safety Excellence) common interest group and three student sections. ### **Preparing for a Tornado**

Ready.gov - Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA)



Sign up for your community's warning system. Listen to a local radio station. EAS and NOAA Weather Radio also provide emergency alerts.

Know where nearby weather sirens are located, become familiar with the warning tone.

Pay attention to weather reports – especially if you plan to be driving or outside.

Plan for your pet's needs in the event of a warning.

Pack a "Go Bag" with nonperishable food, water, personal items such as contacts/hearing aids/medication/chargers, mask, wipes, garbage bags, etc.

#### **During a Tornado**

Go to a safe location immediately and stay until notified it is safe to come out.

Cover your head/neck with your arms, get under furniture or blankets.

If you in a vehicle, if you can safely get to a place lower than the level of the road – leave your car and go there – cover your head with your arms, a coat/blanket. If you cannot safely get to a lower area - stay in the car with your seatbelt on, cover your head with blankets/coats. Avoid seeking shelter under bridges and overpasses as these may create deadly traffic hazards and offer little protection against flying debris.

#### After a Tornado

Save phone calls for emergencies. Use text messaging to communicate with family and friends.

Stay clear of fallen power lines or broken utility lines/poles.

During clean-up, wear appropriate PPE such as thick soled, enclosed shoes, long pants, work gloves and a mask.
