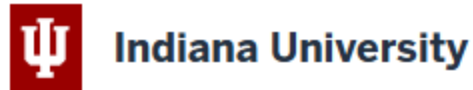

June is Trench Safety Month

June is recognized as Trench Safety Month, a critical reminder to focus on preventing trenching and excavation hazards that continue to pose serious risks on job sites. OSHA emphasizes that trench collapses, or cave-ins, are the leading cause of fatalities in this work, making proper protective measures essential.

Employers and workers alike should ensure trenches are properly sloped, benched, shored, or shielded, while also maintaining safe entry and exit points, keeping materials away from edges, and monitoring for water or atmospheric hazards. Above all, no one should enter a trench that has not been properly inspected—because every precaution taken can save a life.

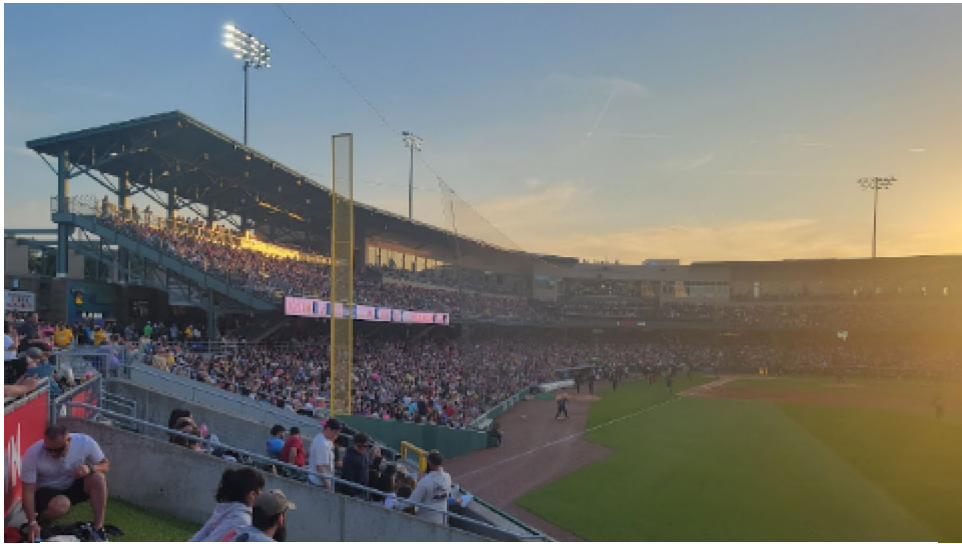
May Chapter Meeting
